How can we find the right mental health training for our staff?

A guide for employers, people managers and HR managers in Leeds.

It's good practice to develop a training plan as part of your wellbeing strategy. The best approach is to pick and choose appropriate levels of training for different managers and team members rather than to roll out one type of training to all staff.

Your plan should consider the particular needs of your workforce and all the different training options available. You may want to consider a stepped approach which introduces:

- Mental health awareness training for all staff including managers and new starters.
- A number of designated Mental Health First (MHFA) Aiders and MHFA Champions who are spread across teams in your organisation.
- Training for managers to help them feel confident supporting their team members.
- Resilience training as part of personal skills development.

Mental health awareness training

MHFA England

The MHFA England offers Mental Health Aware, a half day introductory course, which gives people:

- An understanding of what mental health is and how to challenge stigma.
- A basic knowledge of some common mental health issues.
- An introduction to looking after your own mental health and maintaining wellbeing.
- Confidence to support someone in distress or who may be experiencing a problem with their mental health.

Making Every Contact Count

<u>Leeds City Council</u> offers free training to people working in Leeds who have an interest in health and wellbeing, or have a role that includes this. The training can help you in <u>Making Every</u>

<u>Contact Count (MECC)</u> with customers, clients/patients and colleagues to maintain or improve their mental and physical health where possible, whatever your role or the purpose of the contact.

The course will help participants to:

- Gain added skills and confidence to deliver a MECC chat/conversation around a health and wellbeing topic.
- Learn practical tools to help in having MECC conversations.
- Increase awareness of the services in Leeds around key health and wellbeing topics.

Training for Mental Health First Aiders and Champions

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a two day course which qualifies you as a Mental Health First Aider and teaches you how to:

- Identify, understand and help someone who may be experiencing a problem with their mental health.
- Listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis and even potentially stop a crisis from happening.
- Recognise warning signs of mental ill health, and develop the skills and confidence to approach and support someone while keeping yourself safe.
- Empower someone to access the support they might need for recovery or successful management of symptoms.

MHFA Champions is a one day course which gives people:

- An understanding of common mental health issues.
- Knowledge and confidence to advocate for mental health awareness.
- Ability to spot signs of mental ill health.
- Skills to support positive wellbeing.

Suicide prevention training

SafeTALK

<u>Community Links</u> offers SafeTalk training which prepares you to recognise and talk to people with thoughts of suicide and to connect them with further help. The three hour course is suitable for anyone who may come into contact with individuals at risk of suicide, either at work or in their personal life.

Course participants will be able to:

- Recognise those who may be at risk of suicide.
- Ask individuals clearly and openly about their thoughts of suicide.
- Connect individuals at risk to local sources of help.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

<u>Community Links</u> offers ASIST training in Suicide First Aid skills. ASIST teaches participants to recognise when someone may have thoughts of suicide and work with them to create a plan that will that will support their immediate safety.

Course participants will learn to:

- Recognise invitations for help.
- Reach out and offer support.
- Review the risk of suicide.
- Apply a suicide intervention model.
- Link people with community resources.
